RUSS CLINE

President/Owner

For the past 22 years, Russ Cline has been strategically involved with the Philadelphia Wings and the National Lacrosse League. Russ and partner Chris Fritz co-founded the Major Indoor Lacrosse League (MILL) in 1987. Together they pioneered and promoted the obscure sport of indoor lacrosse in the United States and are largely responsible for the games growth and development today. For twelve years Cline and Fritz owned and operated the first sole proprietary owned league in US sports history. In 1997, the MILL dissolved into the current National Lacrosse League (NLL) where each team is independently owned and operated. Cline and Fritz retained ownership of the Philadelphia Wings where Cline has also served as President for the past nine years. Cline was inducted to the National Lacrosse League Hall of Fame in 2006 and was a member of its inaugural class.



Cline established himself as one of Kansas City's leading businessmen during his association with the Kansas City Chiefs of the National Football League from 1974-1983 where he is regarded as a pioneer in the marketing of NFL teams through multi-event and cooperative sponsorships. In 1984, Cline formed RCA Group, an international sports and entertainment production and promotion company. RCA Group's major clients have included ESPN and ABC Sports-with whom they assisted in the development of action sports events like the X Games, three years as producers of the AND1 Mix Tape Tour and 18 years producing Davis/Fed Cup tennis for the United States Tennis Association. In 2005 RCA Group was selected by the Kansas City Chamber of Commerce as one of the "Top 10 Small Businesses" in Kansas City. In addition, Cline is the owner and President of Image Impact, a company that develops proprietary software for use in evaluating and identifying sponsorship logos in televised events.

Russ Cline is actively involved in a variety of Kansas City area civic and charitable organizations including the Board of Trustees of William Jewell College, City Union Mission, and numerous church and community committees and was recently inducted into the New York Boys Club All Sports Hall of Fame. He was also recognized as NLL Executive of the Year in 2001.

Cline and his wife Melanie have a 22 year old son, Ryan. He also has two grown daughters, Lisa Cline Boehm and Lori Cline Mosier and eight grandchildren.

MICHAEL FRENCH

Co-Owner and Executive Vice-President



Michael French has been a former Philadelphia Wings player, coach, general manager and team advisor since their inception in 1987. He entered into a partnership agreement with the current ownership group, led by Russ Cline, prior to the start of the 1998 season.

French brings local leadership and ownership to a team that has historically been one of the league's strongest performers. He has been an integral component in the team's six league championships

in 1989, 1990, 1994, 1995, 1998, and 2001.

An accomplished player, French led the Wings in scoring in the inaugural season and prior to that was a three-time First Team All-American at Cornell University. He captained the undefeated National Championship team at Cornell and was named The Ivy League and NCAA College Player of the Year. Two years later, French also captained the Canadian National Team to its first World's Championship and was voted the tournament's "Best and Fairest Player." He also represented Canada as a player in 1974 as well as 1978 and 1982 as the teams captain.

In 1991 French was honored as the first Canadian player inducted into the U.S. Lacrosse Hall of Fame and was inducted into the Canadian Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2001. On February 16, 2007, French was inducted to the National Lacrosse League Hall of Fame.

French is a partner at PricewaterhouseCoopers, overseeing their National Hospitality and Leisure Advisory Practice. He, his wife Liz, and their daughter Sara, reside in Radnor, PA.



CHRIS FRITZ

Co-Owner and Executive Vice President

Chris Fritz has made an exciting and rewarding career in the entertainment industry. Chris' promotional career started in Chicago and has evolved over the past 45 years from club owner and manager to concert and sports promoter. His promotions have attracted millions of music and sports fans nationally and internationally.

In 1983, Chris teamed up with long-time business acquaintance Russ Cline, then Marketing Director for the Kansas City Chiefs. They

collaborated in the formation of several companies, using their expertise to produce sports and entertainment events.

Chris was a partner in United Sports of America, a major promoter of motor sports in the United States and Canada; Globe Construction, a company that specialized in event production construction; and in 1984 was co-founder, along with Russ Cline, of the Major Indoor Lacrosse League, owning all of the teams until 1998. Chris is currently the co-owner of the Philadelphia Wings and was inducted into the National Lacrosse League Hall of Fame in 2006 as a member of its inaugural class.

In addition, Chris partnered with Russ Cline to produce the AND1 Mix Tape Tour for three years. Chris has been involved with artist management in the past, representing Kansas City's "Racy Grace" and Austin, Texas' "Meridianwest Band". He is also president of New West Presentations, which took over Sandstone Amphitheater in early 2008. Now called Capitol Federal Park at Sandstone, the venue is known for its green initiatives and eco-friendly approach. Capitol Federal Park at Sandstone closed its first season with an impressive 13 shows.

Chris Fritz currently resides in Leawood, Kansas and has five children and one grandchild. He enjoys music, movies, travel, playing golf, boating and attending Wings games.

LINDSAY SANDERSON

General Manager

Lindsay Sanderson was introduced as General Manager of the Philadelphia Wings on June 23, 2004, becoming the sixth GM in franchise history.

Sanderson doubled as the Wings GM and Head Coach from 2004-06. Before starting his career with the Wings Sanderson was the Assistant Coach for the Toronto Rock during the 2003-04 season, helping to guide the team to an 8-2 record after taking over mid-season with Head Coach Terry Sanderson. He spent two seasons prior to that with the Ottawa Rebel, serving as the General Manager and Defensive Coach during the 2002-03 season. Sanderson assumed the duties of General Manager and Head Coach for the Rebel mid-way during the 2001-02 season after starting his NLL coaching career with the Montreal Express as an Assistant Coach.

In addition to his NLL coaching experience, Sanderson has coached the Barrie Lakeshores of the Ontario Lacrosse Association since 2005. Previous to that, he was the head coach of the Orangeville Jr. A Northmen of the OLA since 1993 where he made two Minto Cup appearances in 2000 and 2003. He was named Ontario Jr. A Coach of the Year in 1999 and 1995.

Sanderson resides in Orangeville, ON and has three children; Brandon, Phillip and Nathan.



DAVE HUNTLEY

Head Coach

Dave Huntley was named the sixth Head Coach in Philadelphia Wings history on June 6, 2007 and will be entering his second season on the bench for the team.

Huntley is a four-time coach of the Canadian National Team and was most recently an assistant coach for the squad that won the gold medal at the 2006 World Championships. He has also served as an assistant coach for the Baltimore Bayhawks of Major League Lacrosse (2003-2005) and helped guide the team to a championship in 2005. Huntley has been involved with the NLL since its inception as The Eagle League in 1987. He was the first General Manager in Philadelphia Wings history and has worked in a variety of capacities for the Baltimore Thunder, Pittsburgh Crossefire, Washington Power and Colorado Mammoth prior to rejoining the Wings this year.

As a player, Huntley was a three-time All-American at Johns Hopkins University and was a member of their 1978 and '79 NCAA Championship Teams. The Toronto, ON native was awarded the McLaughlin Award in 1979 as the National Midfielder of the Year and is a member of John Hopkins All-Time Team. Internationally, Huntley was a member of Canada's 1978 World Championship team and in 1999 was inducted into the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Lacrosse Hall Of Fame.

Huntley resides in Towson, MD with his wife Nancy. The couple has two children, a daughter, Michelle, and a son, Kevin, who was a first-round selection in this year's NLL entry draft.





CHRIS SANDERSON

Assistant Coach

Chris Sanderson was named Assistant to the Head Coach on September 1, 2004. As he enters his fifth season with the Wings, Sanderson will serve as the only assistant to new Wings Head Coach David Huntley.

Sanderson is currently the Director and Head Coach of True North Lacrosse Club. His coaching resume also includes a stint as an Assistant Coach for Canada's Under 19 National Team in 1998 and

1999. In addition to coaching, Sanderson is the President of True North Lacrosse Inc., a lacrosse event and apparel company. In March 2007, Chris opened the True North Lacrosse Company, a specialty lacrosse shop in Pennington, NJ.

During his five-year playing career as a goaltender in the National Lacrosse League, Sanderson was a member of the Baltimore Thunder, the New Jersey Storm, and the Philadelphia Wings. During his two seasons with the Wings, he played in twelve games, and was a member of the 2001 NLL Championship team. He was also a member of the University of Virginia's 1997 ACC Championship squad and played in the NCAA tournament in each of his four collegiate seasons.

Sanderson was also the starting goaltender for the gold medal winning Canadian National field lacrosse team at the World Championships in 2006 and was selected as the All World goaltender. He also earned silver at the '98 and '02 championships and was also selected as the All World goalie at the 1998 games in Baltimore.


Chris resides in Pennington, NJ with his wife Brogann, daughters Stevenson and Clementine.

THE NATIONAL LACROSSE LEAGUE is North America's professional indoor lacrosse league, featuring the best lacrosse players in the world. The NLL has twelve teams playing in the major markets of the United States and Canada. NLL teams each play a 16-game regular season schedule (eight home & eight away) that begins in December and runs through April, followed by the Champion's Cup Playoffs. All games are played on the weekends.

Professional indoor lacrosse combines the physical play of hockey with the high scoring, fast pace and play-making style of basketball. Indoor lacrosse is played inside the confines of an ice hockey rink, with glass and rink boards intact. The playing surface consists of a green dieter turf carpet that is laid down over the hockey ice. The two teams combine to score a total of 25 goals in the average NLL game. Each team has five runners (forwards and defenseman) and a goaltender on the floor during the game. Each team dresses eighteen players (sixteen runners and two goaltenders) per game, and the players rotate on and off the floor in shifts, similar to ice hockey. The game consists of four quarters, each fifteen minutes in length. A game that is tied at the end of regulation is decided in a sudden-death overtime. There are no tie games in professional indoor lacrosse.

NLL RULES

ROSTERS: 23 man roster, each team dresses 18 players for games (16 runners and two goalies). A team shall be composed of six (6) players on the floor, 5 runners and one goalie

TIME FORMAT: Four 15-minute quarters; two minutes between quarters; 12 minute halftime.

TIME OUTS: Each team may take two 45-second timeouts per half. A TV game has one timeout per half.

SUDDEN DEATH OVERTIME: Games ending regulation play with a tie score are decided by a sudden death overtime period. Play continues until a goal is scored. More than one overtime period is played if necessary.

10 SECOND VIOLATION: Occurs when team on offense fails to advance the ball past midfield within 10 seconds after taking possession at their end.

FACE-OFFS: To determine possessions at the start of each quarter and after every goal, two players face their sticks at midfield with a referee placing the ball between the heads of the sticks.

SHOT CLOCK: A 30-second clock begins (counting down) when a team assumes possession of the ball. The offensive team must put a shot on goal during that time or they will lose possession. If they do shoot on goal (without scoring) and recover possession of the ball (via rebound/loose ball recovery), the clock is reset for a new 30 seconds

TERMS OF THE TURF

BODY CHECK: Used to slow an opponent who has the ball; must be above the waist and below the neck.

BREAKAWAY: One-on-one (shooter on goalie) scoring opportunity.

CRADLE: Method used to keep the ball inside the pocket of the stick by rocking it back and forth.

CREASE: Only the goalie can stand in this nine-foot radius with the ball. Shooters or their teammates can not stand on (or inside) the line or their goals won't count. Any violation of this rule will disallow the goal.

CROSSCHECK: An defensive strategy using the shaft of the stick to push on an opponent to force a missed or bad shot.

HIDDEN BALL PLAY: A player without the ball cradles his stick, drawing the attention of the defense, while a teammate who has the ball passes or shoots on net.

LOOSE BALL: Occurs when there is no possession and the ball is bouncing, rolling, or rebounding off the boards or goaltender.

LOSS OF POSSESSION: Illegal screens, 30 second shot clock violation, 10 second half court violation, loose ball push, and illegal procedure during faceoffs are among the acts that can cause a team to lose possession of the ball.

MAJOR PENALTY: Five minutes in the penalty box for infractions such as high sticking, boarding, face masking, fighting and spearing.

MAN DOWN: When a team has one less player on the floor than their opponent.

MINOR PENALTY: Two minute penalty for infractions such as delay of game, elbowing, holding, illegal crosschecking, slashing, and tripping, for example.

OFFENSIVE PICK: The legal interference by an offensive player from a set position on a defensive player who is trying to defend the ball carrier.

OUTLET PASS: The first pass from the goaltender or defender that begins the transition from defense to offense.

PENALTY BOX: Where a player goes to sit while serving a two and/or five minute penalty.

POWER PLAY: When a team has an extra man advantage because the other team has at least one player in the penalty box.

SCREEN SHOT: When the goaltender can't see a shot because someone is in the way.

SHORTHANDED: When a team has one or more players in the penalty box and the opponent is at full-strength, or has more players on the floor.

PLAY OF THE GAME

MINOR PENALTIES: On two minute personal fouls, the penalized player is released from the penalty box if a goal is scored before the expiration of the two minutes.

MAJOR PENALTIES: On five minute major personal fouls, the penalized player stays in the box for the duration of the penalty, though the offending team returns to full strength if two goals are scored against them during the five minutes. When a second major penalty is imposed on the same player in a

game, an automatic game misconduct penalty shall be imposed.

USE OF PENALTY SHOT: Since a team cannot be more than two men down at a time, if a third penalty is called, the official will award a penalty shot to the non-offending team.

EJECTION FROM GAME: Players can be ejected from a game for several reasons including being the third man participating in a fight or accumulating two major penalties in one game.

SLOW WHISTLE (DELAYED PENALTY): If a defending player commits a minor or major penalty against an opponent in possession of the ball where there is offensive momentum and the opponent doesn't lose possession, the official raises his hand and does not blow the whistle until a shot is taken, the 30-second shot clock expires, or a goal is scored or possession is lost.

COINCIDENTAL PENALTIES: When each team is given the same amount of penalty time arising out of the same incident, the offending players shall not be released until the expiration of the penalty. Teams do not lose floor strength, and the ball is awarded to the team who was in possession prior to the fouls.

FIELD & GOALS: Indoor lacrosse is played on a hockey rink covered by an artificial turf playing surface, which is usually referred to as the floor or the carpet (as opposed to the field). There must be boards around the sides of a minimum height of 3' high. Dimensions are 200' x 85' but may be altered.

GOALS: are 4' (high) x 4'9" (wide). The circle around the goal known as the crease is 9'3" in diameter. An offensive player is not allowed to intentionally step into the crease area.

March 13, 1986: Chris Fritz and Russ Cline incorporate the Eagle Pro Box Lacrosse League. Fritz is named President and Cline Executive Vice President. The League was to play in 1987 with four teams: Washington Wave at the Capital Centre; Baltimore Thunder at the Baltimore Arena; Philadelphia Wings at the Spectrum; and the New Jersey Saints at the Meadowlands Arena.

January 10, 1987: The Wings play in the first league game at New Jersey in which the Saints defeat the Wings by a score of 11-8 before a crowd of 5,976 fans.

March 6, 1988: The New Jersey Saints eliminate the Philadelphia Flyers from the playoffs with a 12-10 victory in front of a crowd of 4,118.

May 15, 1988: The league becomes known as the Major Indoor Lacrosse League (MILL).

April 7, 1989: The Wings win their first League Championship with a win over the New York Saints, 11-10 in front of 16,042 fans at the Spectrum.

February 17, 1990: The Wings edge the Baltimore Thunder by a score of 13-12 in the League's first regular season double overtime game in history.

March 24, 1990: The New York Saints defeat the Wings 8-5, before the first sellout and largest crowd in League history - 17,177 at the Spectrum.

March 26, 1990: The Wings' Brad Kotz and John Tucker are named as part of the League's first All-Pro team.

April 7, 1990: The Wings become the first team to win two League Championship Games, as they defeat the New England Blazers 17-7, in front of 11,479 fans at the Spectrum.

April 20, 1991: The National Division All-Stars defeat the American Division All-Stars 25-20 at the Inaugural League All-Star Game at the Spectrum in front of 7,658 fans.

April 11, 1992: The Buffalo Bandits defeat the Wings 11-10 in an overtime victory to capture the League's World Championship.

February 6, 1993: Paul Gait becomes the first League player to score 100 career goals during a six-goal, two-assist night to help the Wings defeat the New York Saints 13-8.

April 10, 1993: Buffalo defeats the Wings 13-12 at Memorial Auditorium to secure their second consecutive League Championship.

March 26, 1994: The Wings' Paul Gait breaks his own League record of eight goals in a game by scoring ten against the Boston Blazers at Boston Garden.

April 6, 1994: The Wings' Tom Marechek is named Rookie of the Year.

April 16, 1994: The Wings defeat the Buffalo Bandits, 26-15 to capture their third League Championship, the most of any team, at Memorial Auditorium in front of 16,284 fans.

March 11, 1995: The Wings break the League's attendance record as 17,380 fans witness the Wings defeat of the Baltimore Thunder in the regular season finale.

March 26, 1995: Gary Gait is named the MVP of the League.

April 8, 1995: The Wings win back-to-back championships by defeating the Rochester Knighthawks, 15-14, in a thrilling overtime game. The Wings have won four League titles in their nine-year history.

February 2, 1996: The Wings announce their all-time 10th Anniversary team in a pre-game ceremony before facing the Rochester Knighthawks in the CoreStates Spectrum.

April 9, 1996: Gary Gait is named League MVP for the second consecutive season.

April 12, 1996: The Buffalo Bandits deny the Wings a third consecutive League World Championship by defeating the Wings 15-10 in front of a sold-out Memorial Auditorium.

January 1, 1997: The Wings join the Philadelphia Flyers and 76ers at the brand new CoreStates Center as they defeat the Baltimore Thunder 16-11.

April 8, 1997: Gary Gait is named as the winner of the League's MVP award for the third straight season.

July 21, 1997: A new entity, combining the tradition of the MILL with two expansion teams and individual team ownership is announced - the National Lacrosse League.

March 21, 1998: The largest crowd of the season, 17,077 watch the host Philadelphia Wings drop at 15-14 decision to the New York Saints at the CoreStates Center.

April 18, 1998: The Wings sweep the best-of-three Championship Series with a 17-12 win over the Baltimore Thunder after having won 16-12 two days earlier. The win is Philadelphia's fifth in franchise history. Wings goaltender Dallas Eliuk is named Championship Series MVP.

April 24, 2001: The League names Wings President and co-owner Russ Cline as the League's Top Executive and Head Coach Tony Resch as Coach of the Year for the 2001 season.

April 27, 2001: The Wings win their sixth League Championship Title with a 9-8 win over the Toronto Rock at the Air Canada Centre in front of 19,409 fans. Wings goaltender Dallas Eliuk is named MVP.

April 9, 2005: The Wings All-Time Leading Scorer, Tom "Hollywood" Marechek, plays his final professional indoor lacrosse game.

February 18, 2006: Tom "Hollywood" Marechek's number is retired, the first retired number in Wings history.

February 23, 2006: Wings Owners Russ Cline and Chris Fritz are inducted into the NLL Hall of Fame as part of its inaugural class.

February 16, 2007: Wings Owner Mike French is inducted into the NLL Hall of Fame along with Wings superstar Tom "Hollywood" Marachek.

June 6, 2007: The Wings hire David Huntley, making him the sixth Head Coach in team history.

February 28, 2008: Former Wings Head Coach Tony Resch is inducted into the NLL Hall of Fame.

April 12, 2008: Forward Athan Iannucci breaks the National Lacrosse League single season goal scoring record, previously held by Gary Gait (60), when he scored his 61st goal versus the Minnesota Swarm at the Xcel Energy Center.

April 19, 2008: The Wings take on the New York Titans at home in the Wachovia Center in front of 17,340 fans; the most since the 2002 season.

April 27, 2008: Philadelphia qualifies for the Champions Cup Playoffs for the first time since 2002 with a 15-14 victory over the Toronto Rock at the Air Canada Centre.


